Thankgiving leads into Advent

This past Tuesday, St Andrew Parish participated in a Community Ecumenical Prayer Service for Thanksgiving at the Blue Grass Presbyterian Church (just across the road from us). I was priviladged to serve with ministers from the Presbyterian Church as well as the First Baptist Church of Blue Grass and Calvary United Methodist Church of Walcott. This service gave witness of movement toward Christian unity. During his Passion, Jesus prayed to the Father, "*That they may all be one*." (John 17:21) The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: *The desire to recover the unity of all Christians is a gift of Christ and a call of the Holy Spirit*.



Pastor Joy Mitchell of Calvary United Methodist Church gave the sermon about gratitude. She was first and foremost grateful for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and said that at the very least all Christians can agree on that. In our divisve society, this a beacon of hope that we can find common ground among people of different faith traditions, but with the same core belief in Jesus Christ. Sure there are serious differences in theology and tradition, but by focusing on what we have in common we can reconcile our differences.

As we move into Advent this Sunday, preparing ourselves to celebrate the Birth of our Lord and Savior, and at the same time preparing ourselves for the Second Coming of our Lord, we can continue the practice of gratitude. We can look more closely for the signs of Christ's presence in our lives, even in little ways, in "Holy Moments" – and give thanks to Him for those gifts. To do that and other preparations, the parish Faith Formation team has put together a special activity in which we all can participate to be more intentional in preparing our hearts for Jesus this Advent. Divine Mercy

Thanks to a generous, anonymous donor, the Image of Divine Mercy has been added to our Day Chapel. The devotion to Divine Mercy comes from a vision that St Faustina had in 1931. Our Lord appeared to her and directed that this image be venerated throughout the world, to encourage souls to know of and request in prayer Jesus' divine mercy. Jesus said "Proclaim to the whole world My unfathomable mercy. Proclaim that mercy is the greatest attribute of God." In the Divine Mercy image of Christ, the rays denote Blood and Water. Jesus said" no soul is beyond the reach of His infinite mercy, if only the soul will ask for it. Even the most hardened sinner will repent when they hear of My unfathomable mercy, about the compassion I have for them in my Heart". He encouraged frequent confession, frequent reception of Holy Eucharist to receive graces, and especially on Divine Mercy Sunday, on that day to receive total forgiveness of sins and punishment. He encouraged praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet, coming to the font of His Divine Mercy, to save dying souls and pray for sinners.
