



From the Desk of Deacon Matt

Have you ever noticed that when Jesus begins his mission and goes out to call disciples, he does not go to Jerusalem, to the temple, or to a synagogue at all? Instead, he goes down to the shores of the Sea of Galilee. As he told religious authorities later, he came to call sinners, not the righteous. He chooses to go down to the sea to walk among sailors and fishers, not up to the synagogue to find those at prayer. St. Andrew along with his brother Simon, were the first to be called to join Jesus. Our own parish is named after this worthy Saint. By our baptism, we are each called to be disciples of the Lord. We are called to follow Jesus. We are Jesus' hands and voices now, called to spread the gospel, by living to give the Gospel with our lives. Today we hear how He sets an example for the first disciples . . . and for His current disciples.

Saint Paul urges the Corinthians to unity in Christ. I urge the community here at St. Andrew to unity in each other. The problem Paul addresses is not one of diversity, for indeed Paul initiated diversity by living to give the Gospel in cities and towns all over the Mediterranean, where he encountered many different cultures, languages, and traditions. My Brothers and Sisters, the problem was divisiveness and rivalries. Corinthians were allying with the person who introduced them to Christ, rather than with Christ himself. The church, Paul realized, must be one, and be one in Christ. And so should the parish at St. Andrew. There cannot be divisiveness and rivalries if we are to be called Christian. If we are Living to Give the Gospel, then we are Glorifying the Lord and Becoming the Good News by Being the Good News.
