

#### From the Desk of Deacon Matt

The Sea of Galilee, by our standards, is really a lake, but to ancient fishermen it was a Sea. It is a beautiful body of water nestled by hills and mountains on three sides. It also was a source of survival for most of the people who lived in that region. It is not a surprise to see Peter out on the sea fishing. He was, after all, a fisherman. Without Jesus to lead him, Peter returns to his old vocation. It is also unsurprising to see him fishing at night. From the middle of the sea, he won't be able to hear the rooster crowing at dawn, that daily reminder of his betrayal on that fateful morning. Finally, it was inevitable that their labor produce nothing; the same thing happened before they encountered Jesus the first time. Symbolically, the contrast between their catch without Jesus (zero) and with Jesus (one hundred fifty-three, thought to represent all the known species) cannot be more different. The fact that Jesus Himself is directing where to place their nets seems spiritual, but from where Jesus would have been standing on the shoreline, the Lord would have seen the glimmering of fish underneath the surface of the water. Maybe our Lord does have that advantage of seeing what we don't often see, but our willingness to listen and then follow the direction of our Lord is what Jesus wants from us. At last, Peter realizes that his true vocation is to "catch" disciples from every place on earth. It should not be lost on us to remember that after Jesus had been arrested and taken away, Peter stood by a charcoal fire to warm himself when he was accused three times of being one of Jesus' disciples. Now, after Jesus has died and risen and returned to reveal himself to his disciples, he and Peter are again surrounding a charcoal fire when Jesus asks him three times if he loves him. Jesus had known that Peter would deny him three times. Now he gives him the opportunity to reconcile with him three times. By allowing Peter to make amends, Jesus forgives him. Though we do not hear the cock crow at all, we are told all this happens after dawn. With dawn, a new day for Peter and all the disciples arises. Today, my Sisters and Brothers we are offered a new dawn, a new day to recognize the love, mercy and forgiveness offered to us by our heavenly Father. And then, to be love, mercy and forgiveness to each other.


